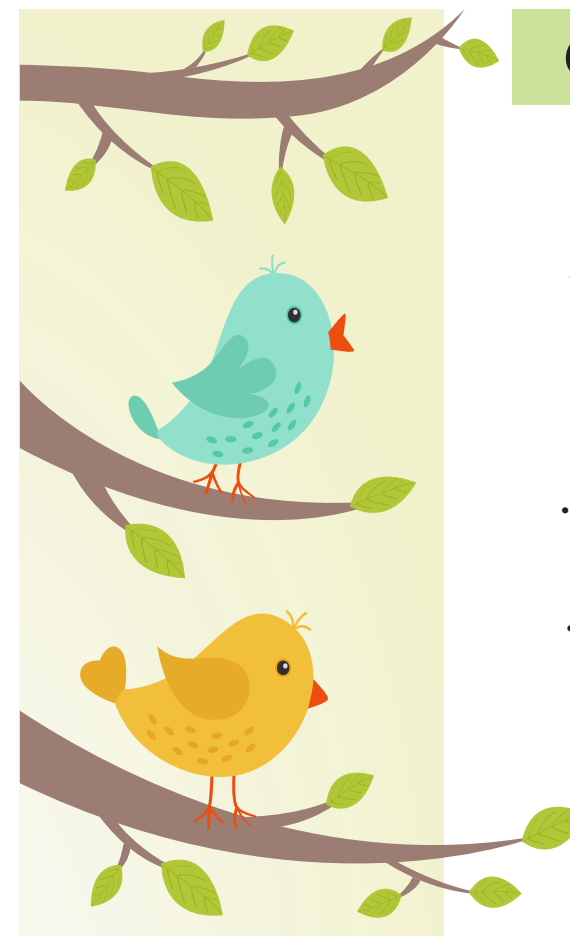

Getting Smarter With Smart Speakers

Voice automated assistants were a big item this past holiday season. You probably heard them referred to as smart speakers or by the name Google Home. Google Home and other smart speakers enable users to speak voice commands to interact with services, perform everyday tasks and even control their home. Here are some great ways to use your Google Home.

Get Answers – a world of knowledge is always an internet search away. With a Google Home you can ask questions that you may normally search and get helpful answers with out the distraction of having to pull out your device. From the practical (Hey Google, what's the weather going to be tomorrow?) to inquisitive (Ok Google, what's the ginseng capital of the world?), you can ask your question while you continue on with your day.

Command Your Audio – Google Home connects with music services like Tuneln, Pandora, Spotify, and Google Play music. Ask Google to play a song, a station, or a playlist. Adjust the volume, skip to the next song, shuffle or ask what song is playing – all with voice commands. Looking for news or podcasts, you can ask for headlines from your favorite outlet or to start or even resume a specific podcast.

Manage Your Day – Ask Google about your day to hear your schedule, traffic details and what kind of weather to prepare for. Set reminders for yourself (Hey Google, remind me to pick up balloons on Thursday or Ok Google, what are my reminders for today)?



Set timers (Hey Google, set a timer for 12 minutes) or alarms (Hey Google, wake me up at 5:30 a.m. tomorrow). Add things to your shopping list and check that list on your phone while you are in the store or order things right away from a variety of Google Express retailers.

Control Your Home – as you integrate smart home devices into your home, your Google Home can become hands-free control for things like smart light bulbs (Hey Google, play Stranger Things on my TV).

Whether you have a smart speaker or you are looking to get one, there is always more to do with this growing technology and you will quickly go from questioning whether you really need it to not knowing how you lived without it. 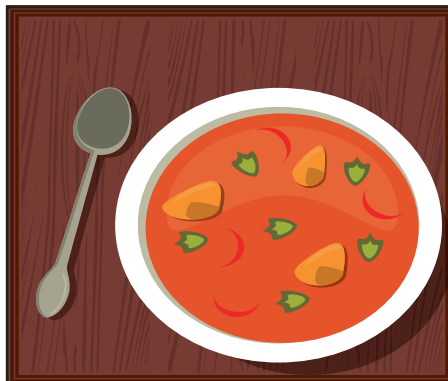
Christus Lutheran Church, 120 N. Main Street, continues their Soup & Salad Suppers each Wednesday through March 21, 4:30-6:30 p.m..

Dr. Wiley Comes Home to Shawano, Clintonville

Her Interests are Family Medicine, Obstetrics, and GlobalHealth

Jasmine Wiley grew up in Clintonville and graduated from high school there before heading off to University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, where she double-majored in biology and American Indian studies. As she contemplated medical school, the Wisconsin Academy of Rural Medicine (WARM) at UW School of Medicine and Public Health offered a very strong match for her interests, and she is now proud to be a WARM program alum. WARM medical students complete their first two years of medical school in Madison and then practice in rotation in small community settings throughout the state compared to primarily completing rotations in Madison or Milwaukee.

"I've always wanted to return home after training," said Dr. Wiley. "I'm a small town girl, and WARM offered clinical training experiences that integrate doctors into

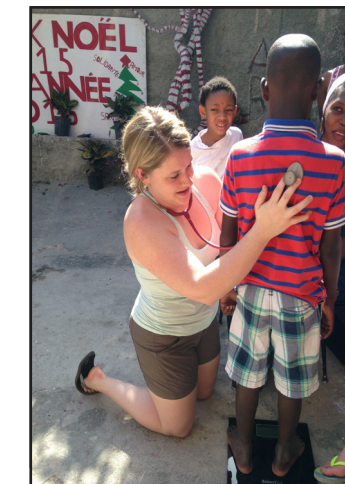
smaller communities in Wisconsin. The training recognizes that rural health is different than health care in urban centers, and it gives us a chance to experience challenges in these settings early in our careers." As part of the WARM program, Dr. Wiley completed her medical school clinical rotations in the Marshfield Clinic system, spending time in Marshfield, Eau Claire and Rice Lake, and also at ThedaCare Physicians-Shawano and the Menominee Tribal Clinic.

After medical school Dr. Wiley completed her residency in family medicine at Aurora Health Care in Milwaukee where she received comprehensive training in full scope family medicine, a type of practice that includes obstetrics. She also pursued her passions for integrative medicine, working with underserved communities, and international medicine

during which time she made several trips to Haiti. While in Milwaukee, Dr. Wiley also worked to develop a relationship between the Aurora Family Medicine residency program and the Gerald L. Ignace Indian Health Center to help provide quality care to Milwaukee's urban Native American communities.

Dr. Wiley joined ThedaCare Physicians-Shawano and Clintonville last fall. As she began her job search, she said ThedaCare was able to offer her "the perfect fit" with opportunities to pursue her interest in global health, practice full scope family medicine, and come back home to work with a strong team of physicians and advanced practice clinicians. "I look forward to building a career here and helping support the health and wellness of the communities that have supported me for so many years," she said.

With a house on the Wolf



River in Shawano and Molly, her rat terrier-blue healer mix, at her side, Dr. Wiley is adapting to the lifestyle of a busy primary care doctor in a bustling small town clinic. "Not all primary care doctors get to deliver babies, and that's one of the best parts of my job here," she said. "It feels good to be back home and meeting so many kind and welcoming people."

Swim Team Receives \$5,000 Grant

CLINTONVILLE, WI – In addition to \$14,000 in grants awarded to six charitable organizations serving the Clintonville area, the Clintonville Area Foundation has awarded a special \$5,000 grant to the Clintonville Area Swim Team (CAST).

The grants, which benefit a range of community causes, were awarded from a variety of charitable funds within the community foundation this year. The CAST grant, which is earmarked toward the purchase of a new scoreboard for the Clintonville Recreation Center pool, was awarded from the Clintonville Area Recreational Endowment Fund held within the CAF family of funds. The purpose of this fund is designated to fund projects associated with the recreation center and its activities.

“The Foundation’s mission to enhance and improve the social, cultural, educational, health and general well being of the people in the Clintonville Area was well served with these grants,” said Connie Carpenter, Advisory Board Chairperson of the Clintonville Area Foundation. “We are happy to award these grants to benefit our community.”

Eligible nonprofit organizations submitted grant requests through the Foundation’s annual competitive process. The Foundation’s volunteer grants committee members recommend grant recipients to the advisory board for approval.

The following grants were approved:

- Clintonville Area Swim Team - \$5,000 toward the purchase of a new scoreboard for the Clintonville Recreation Center pool.
- CESA 8 - \$1,250 to sponsor two Clintonville area teachers in the CESA 8 Career Academy Teacher Externship program.
- Clintonville Area Ambulance Service - \$1,250 to provide supplies for a flu vaccine clinic allowing local residents access to free flu shots.
- Clintonville Goodfellows Association - \$1,000 to purchase food and gifts for children for the annual Goodfellows holiday distribution.
- Clintonville Police Department - \$3,000 to fund the purchase, training and care of a K-9 patrol in the City of Clintonville after the unexpected loss of former K-9, Chero.



- Clintonville Public Schools-Rexford Longfellow Elementary - \$3,000 to provide a class set of heart rate monitors to be used by students in grades K-4 to help them get excited about and better understand their personal fitness.
- Navarino Nature Center - \$2,000 to create a natural playscape area at the nature center for young children to explore nature, their imagination and senses.
- Safe Haven Domestic Abuse Support Center - \$2,500 to support the costs of furnishing a bedroom and the installation of new security equipment as part of a building expansion.

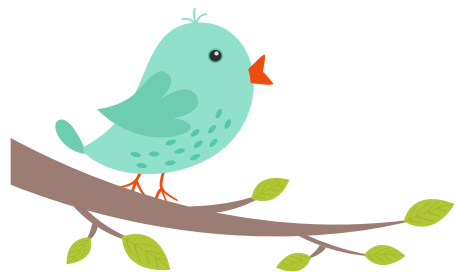
