



Spring Trail Fun Run/Walk (5K & 10K) & 1 mile Kid's Run

Run or walk through the fields, forests, and wetlands of the Navarino Wildlife Area.

Children Can Suffer Depression Signs and Symptoms Should Not Be Ignored

Kids can be moody. However, be watchful for symptoms and signs that could point to something other than normal everyday emotions.

"If the sadness or anger become disruptive and interfere with social activities, interests, school, and family life, the child could be depressed," said Timothy Houlihan, MD, family doctor at ThedaCare Physicians-New London.

Seek medical assistance if symptoms last more than two weeks. Too often, depression is undiagnosed or untreated with signs being passed off as normal emotional or psychological changes. Studies show that children are getting depressed at an earlier age and can display symptoms similar to adults who are depressed.

"As parents, don't be quick to brush off the signs," said Dr. Houlihan. "There is a stigma surrounding depression and mental health issues, but the child needs help or it could have a damaging impact on their life. Depression is a serious illness but also a treatable one."

While the primary symptoms of depression include sadness, a feeling of hopelessness, and mood changes, here are others to look for in children:

- Irritability or anger
- Continuous feelings of sadness and hopelessness
- · Social withdrawal
- Increased sensitivity to rejection
- Changes in appetite
- Changes in sleep
- Vocal outbursts or crying
- Difficulty concentrating



- Fatigue and low energy
- Feelings of worthlessness or guilt
- · Physical complaints such as stomachache and headache that don't respond to treatment
- Reduced ability to function during events and activities at home or with friends, in school, extracurricular activities, and in other hobbies or interests
- · Impaired thinking or concentration
- Thoughts of death or suicide

Many symptoms will happen at different times and in different settings. Most kids with significant depression will suffer noticeable using drugs or alcohol. "Depression changes in appearance, social activities or school performance. Children over

12 may also begin using drugs and alcohol. Depression is not a passing mood, nor is it a condition that will go away without proper treatment," said Dr. Houlihan.

Family history of depression puts children at greater risk of depression. It can also be caused by factors that relate to physical health, life events, family history, environment.

genetic vulnerability and biochemical disturbance. "Children from chaotic or conflicted families, or children and teens who abuse substances like alcohol and drugs, are also at greater risk of depression," said Dr. Houlihan.

Talk to a doctor about therapy or a questionnaire, which can help determine depression or other mental health concerns that contribute to the depression such as ADHD, conduct disorder, and OCD.

Treatment for depression could include a combination of psychotherapy and medication. It is important the treatment be that which allows the child to grow physically and emotionally in a healthy way. "Depression could occur again in adults later in life," said Dr. Houlihan. "It could also precede more serious mental health illnesses. For that reason, it is crucial to monitor a child's depression."

Wisconsin Child Sales Tax Rebate Parents will Receive \$100 for Each Eligible Child



Beginning May 15, parents and quardians of children under age 18 will be able to claim a \$100 rebate per child. The deadline for filing claims is July 2. This one-time rebate is being promoted as a refund of sales and use tax paid on purchases made for raising a dependent child in 2017.

The Wisconsin department of Revenue is expected to have a website available starting May 15, 2018 where parents may go to claim the credit. Qualified children must be:

Under age 18 on December 31, 2017

Dependent of the claimant for the tax year 2017

Wisconsin resident on December 31, 2017

United States resident

In order to claim the credit. parents will need:

Child's social security number and date of birth

Bank routing number and account number for direct deposit

Rebates are expected to be issued by August which is just in time for back-to-school shopping. In addition to the rebate, the state will also have a sales tax holiday from August 1 through August 5, 2018 on school related purchases. During this time, the following items will not be subject to sales tax:

Clothing with a sales price of up to \$75 per item

School supplies with a sales price of up to \$75 per item

Computers with a sales price of up to \$750

Computer supplies with a price of up to \$250 per item




