



## Towing The Line - Schutt Industries

When Philip Gibbs, a general contractor based in Maryland, was researching adventure trailers online, the XVenture made by Clintonville-based Schutt Industries seemed to be what he was looking for — but it took him a little while to pull the trigger.

“I bounced it around for probably six to eight months, trying to figure out if this would be the trailer for me,” Gibbs recalls. “I finally talked to them on the phone, and they were so helpful and so cooperative it was easy to make the decision to buy something from them.”

Now, Gibbs’ XVenture goes with him on fly-fishing trips in North Carolina and mountain-biking trips along the mid-Atlantic coast.

“I’ve got a daughter that goes to college in Boone, North Carolina, and that’s one of the reasons I went to this trailer — there’s a number of trout streams and sort of rugged, off-the-beaten-path camping there,” Gibbs says.

Built for serious outdoor and off-road enthusiasts, XVenture trailers are just one example of product innovation that keeps Clintonville’s Schutt Industries growing.

Launched in 1998 by founder and CEO Jim Schutt, the company is evolving its experience of building heavy-duty trailers for the U.S. military to entice a new market of buyers while maintaining one-on-one service that attracts clients like Gibbs. That focus on customer service with an eye on product

evolution helped Schutt grow into a company with 90 employees at locations in Clintonville and Shawano that generates about \$20 million in annual revenue.

Dr. Pulse joined the Concordia Theological Seminary (CTSFW), Fort Wayne, faculty in 2007. He serves as associate professor of Exegetical Theology, director of Certification and Placement, and director of Continuing Education. Following graduation from Concordia Teachers College in Seward, Nebraska, with a B.S. in Elementary Education (1980), he attended CTSFW, completing his M.Div. in 1984 and later completing his S.T.M. from CTSFW while in the parish in 1990. He completed his Ph.D. at the University of Durham, England in 2017, in the area of Old Testament, successfully defending his dissertation on “Joseph: A Death and Resurrection figure in the Old Testament and Second Temple Judaism.” His 22 years in the parish were served in St. John’s Lutheran Church, Burt, Iowa, and Peace Lutheran Church, Bremerton, Washington.

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION CLINTONVILLE GARBAGE & RECYCLING SERVICES

Harter's Fox Valley Disposal is the only waste hauler licensed by the City to pick up residential waste and recycling within the City.

Under the City's approved contract with Harter's, the 2019 annual cost per residential property/customer **will not exceed \$133.00** and will be placed directly on the property tax bill as a special charge due and payable with your 2018 property taxes. If your residential property is a rental unit you will need to decide what arrangements to make with your tenant(s). You will be billed for each residential unit that you own up to 4 units. Apartments larger than 4 units in size are not eligible to receive this service. Each property owner that pays for this service will be provided a wheeled cart for weekly garbage pick-up and a wheeled cart for recycling pick-up that will occur every other week. **Further information regarding the garbage and recycling service, including a calendar showing the pick-up schedule, will be available on the city website and at City Hall.**

**Voluntary Opt-Out.** The City is providing an opportunity for residents to voluntarily opt-out of receiving garbage and recycling pick-up. To implement the opt-out, you **MUST** complete and sign the **attached opt-out form** at the bottom of this letter, detach the form, and send or deliver this signed form to City Hall no later than 12:00 pm on Monday, **September 17, 2018**. **The City will not accept telephone calls, messages, or submittal of any other means to opt-out of this collection service.** Multi-family apartments must turn in a form for **each** unit or the property owner will be billed for **all** units. If your form is turned in personally during office hours, you will receive a date stamped and initialed acknowledgement of receipt of the opt-out. Following the opt-out period, you will not be able to change your request for 2019.

Anyone who decides to opt-out of this collection service will be required to personally transport and deliver (without a private hauler) your garbage and recyclable materials to the Clintonville Area Waste Service (CAWS) site at 300 Beacon Avenue and pay the fees that CAWS charges for disposal of your household garbage. **It is prohibited to deposit garbage or recycling into any cart other than your own.**

# Important Documents When Turning 18

## Why College Students Need These

It's an exciting day when your child turns 18 and legally becomes an adult. It's also an important time to help your new adult make some adult decisions. Some of those decisions include completing a couple of serious documents— a power of attorney for health care (POAHC) and a durable power of attorney (POA).

"While the durable power of attorney and power of attorney for health care are typically thought of in relation to older people, it's very important that anyone over the age of 18 also have these documents completed," said Cheryl Seelig, practice administrator for ThedaCare Physicians-New London.

The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPPA) created rules limiting who can have access to an adult person's health information. "Once a child turns 18, their parents no longer have the power to make health care decisions for them. If the young adult gets in an accident or becomes ill enough to require a doctor's care or hospitalization, the parents could find themselves unable to obtain information about the person's condition," Seelig said.

For students heading off to college, completing these documents, especially the POAHC, is essential. "It's frightening for parents to suddenly be unable to find out what's wrong with their child or be involved with their care," Seelig said. "That's why it's so important to have the student

If the young adult has a POAHC completed and signed, whoever is named on that form can obtain health information. Typically the young adult will name parents or another trusted adult.

ThedaCare Health Systems provides online forms and instructions for completing the POAHC. Visit [www.thedacare.org/Policies-and-Legal-Forms.aspx](http://www.thedacare.org/Policies-and-Legal-Forms.aspx). Near the bottom of that page is a link to the forms for Advanced Directives/POAHC.

The durable power of attorney (POA) document allows the student to name someone to handle their finances should they become incapacitated for a period of time.

Again, numerous durable power of attorney forms are available online. In addition, many lawyers will assist in preparing both the POAHC and POA for a reasonable fee.

"It's exciting to send your student off to college. If you've taken care of the POAHC and POA, you can send them off with fewer worries," Seelig said. "Remember to add a well-stocked first-aid kit to their college supplies."

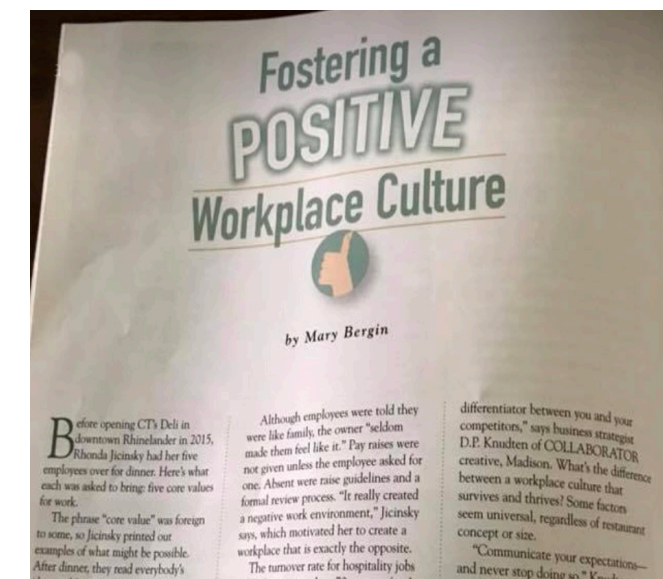
