## Cellcom - Launch of iOS 12

With the launch of iOS 12 came new ways to monitor and curb your device usage and, through Family Sharing, your kids' device usage. The feature is called Screen Time. The feature, found in your settings menu once you download iOS 12, will give you a summary about how you are using your device each day, broken down by categories. You can then dive in and see how much you are using each app, how many notifications you receive from apps or even how many times you are simply picking up your phone. By using Family Sharing, you can also see this data for others on your account.



Once you've seen how much you use your device there are features available to help you control and curb usage. Downtime lets you schedule a time when the device will lock you out of certain apps. This could be at bedtime to prevent you from scrolling social media or watching videos, during family dinners or maybe first thing in the morning to help you get out of bed and get rolling. You can pick which apps are always available, so you can still make

calls, send texts or even keep specific educational apps open for your children. The App Limits feature allows you to set specific limits for each app – again for yourself or for someone on your Family Sharing – or for broad categories like social networking or gaming.

Screen Time now houses Content & Privacy Restrictions, which introduces the tools to remotely keep inappropriate content off a child's device. While these settings were previously available they had to be adjusted on the device itself. You can set whether your child can install new apps, delete apps or make in-app purchases on iTunes or the App Store. This is also where you can set content ratings for books, music, TV shows, movies and apps. You can also turn off location-sharing.

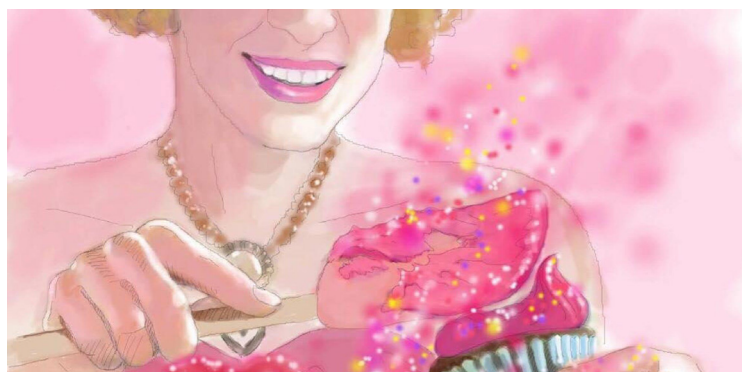

## Tadych's Econofoods Story

When you ask Jim Tadych why he has been in the supermarket business for 50 years, he will tell you it is because he loves people. Being able to fill the needs of his customers has been his passion from the beginning. That mind set has carried Jim from his first store in Brillion WI in July of 1968, to the newest acquisition of his store in Clintonville, WI.

It should come as no surprise Jim Tadych took to the grocery business.

His father, Victor, got into it as a teenager in the 1920's and left school early for his first meat market job. That job led Victor to open Fairview Market in Manitowoc, WI: a small general store & market where Jim started packing potatoes when he was grade school age. He would work before and after school, that is when he and his brother Jerry were not throwing rotten potatoes at each other!

In the early 1960's, Jim took time away from his father's family business to serve his country in the Army. Upon his return, he got married & started his family. Jim realized his father's store could not adequately support the many family members now involved.

So, in the mid 60's he began to search for a store to buy. The search proved difficult until 1968 when he found a small “mom & pop” grocery store in Brillion, WI. It was a turn of the century blacksmith shop converted into a grocery store with less than 700 square feet of space. For decades it was known as Doughty's Grocery, although Keenway name remained on the building. You can find a picture of this store prominently displayed in every Tadych's Econofoods.

Original owner, Francis Doughty had passed away and his wife Freida was ready to sell. However, she hadn't realized Jim was a potential buyer. She thought he was applying for a job. She told him “we're not hiring anymore.”

Ultimately, Freida sold the store to Jim. Both Victor and Freida helped finance the deal and further supported Jim by not calling in their loans during the early years.



The store served as a modest beginning for Jim. He, his wife Pat and their three kids lived above the store. In his first days of self employ, Jim asked himself more than once what he had gotten into.

Fifty years after T&C Market first opened its doors, Jim Tadych knows the answer to the question he asked himself in 1968. “I have gotten into, not only a business or career, but a way of life. A blessed life filled with many challenges. But those challenges are offset by the many great friends, employees & customers I get to work with every day.”

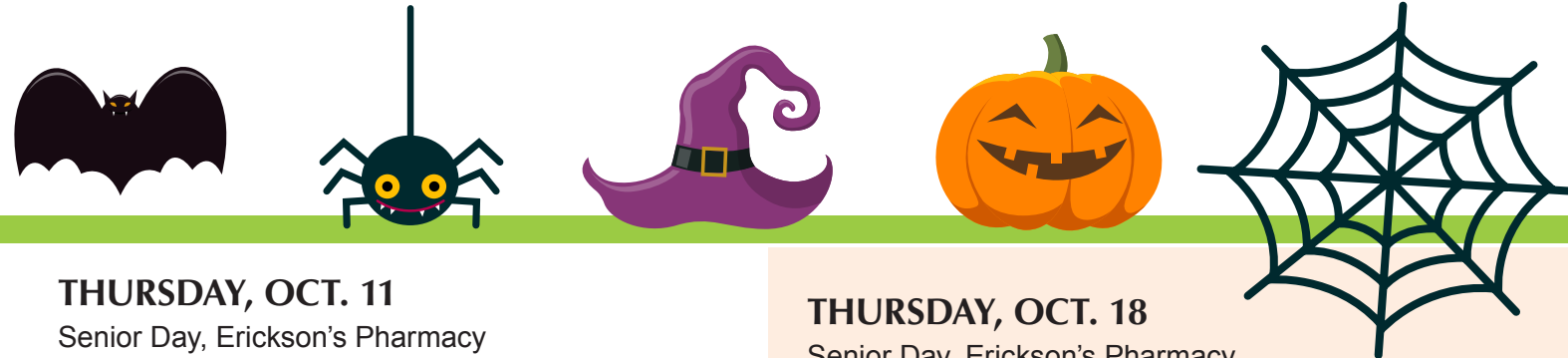

## Arthritis Of The Knee – Tips for Healthy Knees



The knee is the largest joint in our body. It is made up of bone, cartilage, ligaments and tendons that all work together to provide our range of motion. When knee pain or loss of motion begins to affect one's ability to perform common daily tasks or enjoy hobbies – and conservative treatments such as exercising, taking non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) such as ibuprofen or aspirin or resting the knee don't relieve the pain – it's time to visit your doctor.



Knee pain may be the most common complaint heard by orthopedic doctors and, generally, arthritis is the cause. Pain, swelling, grinding, catching and stiffness are the most common signs of arthritis of the knee.

Your primary care provider or orthopedic doctor will likely recommend some lifestyle changes, such as switching from high impact activities (jogging, tennis) to lower impact sports (swimming or cycling). Physical therapy is another option; your doctor or therapist may develop an exercise program to treat your specific issues. Beyond that, your provider may suggest using a cane or other walking aids (knee brace) for a while to relieve stress on the knee or recommend injections of various drugs to reduce inflammation.

arthroscopy, cartilage grafting, osteotomy (the thigh or shin bone may be resurfaced to relieve pressure) or partial or total knee replacement.

Three types of arthritis affect the knee:  
 1. Osteoarthritis is the most common type of knee arthritis. It is a degenerative form of arthritis caused by the "wear and tear" of normal living, specifically the loss of the smooth, gliding cartilage of the knee resulting in bone rubbing on bone.  
 2. Rheumatoid arthritis is a chronic, autoimmune disease that can develop in anyone at any age. It may attack several joints in the body at one time causing inflammation, damaging normal tissue and softening the bone.  
 3. Post-traumatic arthritis typically develops after a significant injury to the knee, though it may not surface until years after the trauma.

If these more conservative measures don't reduce one's knee pain to a tolerable level, surgical options may be considered. Those include

The strength of our knees is a key factor in our ability to have a good range of movement that allows us to enjoy our hobbies, participate in sports, and carry out our daily tasks. We all would be wise to treat our knees respectfully, exercise regularly to maintain the strength of the muscles surrounding our knees and maintain a healthy weight. Our ability to lead an active life, especially in our older years, is directly related to the health of our knees.

A good plan of action to maintain knee health is to perform strengthening exercises. Water aerobics, strength training, yoga and tai chi may help strengthen the muscles surrounding the knee, thereby reduce pain. If you're overweight, losing weight can also reduce stress on the knee.

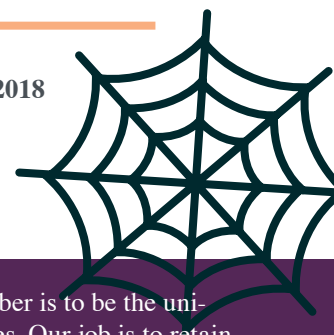
